Admission Requirements

Students applying to the MMBSW program must meet the following admission requirements:

1. A high school diploma or equivalent with a minimum GPA of 2.0 (on a 4.0 scale).

Application Process

Stage 1

Students must complete the online application form and submit it to the Office of Admissions by the deadline of 31. The application fee is \$50.00. Students who are accepted to the program will receive an offer of admission letter by 31.

1. Students must submit a letter of intent to the program coordinator at mmbsw@stthomas.edu.

The letter of intent should be typed, double-spaced, and include the following information:

- Your name and contact information.
- Your reasons for wanting to study in the MMBSW program.
- Your career goals and how the MMBSW program will help you achieve them.
- Any other information that you think is relevant to your application.
