INTR-2003. Preparing for International Living and Work Experience

This course is designed to help students prepare for international living and work experience. It covers topics such as cultural differences, language barriers, and the challenges of living and working in a foreign country. Students will learn how to navigate these challenges and develop the skills necessary for success in an international environment.

INTR-2016. Reflecting on International Living and Work Experience

This course is designed to help students reflect on their international living and work experience. It provides a structured opportunity for students to analyze their experiences, identify their strengths and weaknesses, and develop a plan for future growth. The course includes assignments, discussions, and a final reflection paper.

INTR-3003. Experiential Community-Based Internship

This course provides students with a hands-on learning experience through a community-based internship. Students will work with a community organization or agency to address a real-world problem. The course is designed to provide students with a practical understanding of the challenges and opportunities of community-based work. (1) credit. Prerequisite: Completion of at least one semester of college-level work. This course is a required component of the Bachelor of Science in Community Development program.

INTR-4003. Interdisciplinary Honours Workshop

This workshop is designed for students who are interested in pursuing an interdisciplinary honours thesis. The workshop provides students with the opportunity to work with a faculty advisor to develop a research proposal and to conduct research in a field that is not covered by any one discipline. (1) credit. Prerequisite: Completion of at least one semester of college-level work. This course is a required component of the Bachelor of Science in Community Development program.

INTR-4016. Interdisciplinary Honours Thesis

This thesis is a culminating experience for students who are interested in pursuing an interdisciplinary honours degree. The thesis is a research project that is designed to address a complex problem that requires knowledge from multiple disciplines. (3) credits. Prerequisite: Completion of at least one semester of college-level work. This course is a required component of the Bachelor of Science in Community Development program.
